TYPES OF ALLERGIES

Allergies can manifest themselves with a number of secondary symptoms, but the main primary causes of allergies seen in veterinary practice are:

- 1. Atopy (environmental allergy)
- 2. Food allergy
- 3. Flea allergy/insect bite allergy
- 4. Contact allergy*

	ATOPY	FOOD ALLERGY	FLEA ALLERGY
Cause	-Environmental allergens trigger immune reactionDefects in skin barrier function. Common allergens include: -pollens/grasses -mites (incl dust mites and storage mites)	-Proteins in food cause immune reactionCommon allergens: Dogs: Chicken, beef Dairy Wheat Cats: Fish Beef	Flea saliva causes immune reaction through bites.
Symptoms	-Itchiness, mainly affecting	-Scooting/licking bottom -anal gland issues -Diarrhoea/changes in stool consistency (+/- vomiting) -Chronic bilateral ear infections	-itchiness of rump around tail +/- hair loss and scaly skin. -history of fleas or visible flea dirt/fleas
Treatment	-rule out other kinds of allergies (food, fleas) -Oral corticoteroids - Apoquel -Cytopoint Injections -Cyclosporine (Atopica) (long term) -Topical treatments (Malaseb, Cortavance, neocort) -ASIT -Conjunctive therapy (omega 3, diet, antihistamines, soothing shampoos, essential 6)	-Elimination diet novel protein and carbohydrate diet (e.g. RC Anallergenic or home cooked diet) min 8 weeks SOLELY rechallenge with individual food proteins to determine allergen source serum allergen testing	-Flea allergy trial NexGard/Capstar -Environmental decontamination

^{*}Contact allergies are rare in animals and easily treated. It should also be noted that one animal can have a combination of allergies concurrently.
